

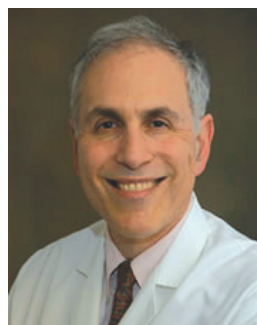
# GENOMICS in Medicine Lecture Series
